Sarkawai targets four go

THE Singapore Silat Federation has set its sights on winning four gold medals at December's South-east Asia Games in Chiangmai.

SSF secretary-general Haji Sarkawai Masom made the forecast after submitting the Sea Games name list to the Singapore National Olympic

Council over the weekend.

Fourteen exponents were nominated.

The four golds are expected from Sheik Alauddin (Open class), Mohamed Hidayat (50-55kg), Abdul Kadir (65-70kg) and Badriah Mohamed Hosni (45-50kg).

In the 1993 Games, the Republic won two golds through Sheik and Hidayat. Badriah was a gold medallist at the 1992 Jakarta World champion-

ships and won a silver at the last Sea Games.

Two newcomers — Jumali Badrin (70-75kg) and Muhammad Jufri Selamat (75-80kg) — have been recommended.

Azman Amat, 1993 Sea Games Class E (60-65kg) bronze medallist was not included following a decision to ban him for pushing and threatening an umpire physically at the nationals.
